

# School-Based Health Care

All students deserve to thrive, but too many struggle because they lack access to health care services. School-based health care is a solution, bringing health care to where students spend a majority of their time. School-based health services are available during school hours to all students and staff.

## HEALTH CARE

Onsite health care professionals collaborate with schools to address the broad range of concerns and adverse experiences that affect students' healthy development. Primary health care services are provided in a comprehensive, integrated, and accessible manner and in a sustained partnership with the student, their parent/guardian family, and provider in order to manage or treat conditions with parental consent.

## BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE

Students may struggle with emotional or behavioral challenges. Ready access to expert attention may provide students with coping strategies to support healthy relationships and academic success. Behavioral health care includes prevention and education services, mental health, substance use, referrals to community resources, and more.

School-based health care is a powerful tool ensuring that students have access to high-quality health care when they need it. By integrating into the education environment, school-based health care contributes directly to the school's mission and delivers outcomes that matter.

### Is there a charge for using School-Based Health Care services?

One Health fees are based on a sliding-fee scale to make health care accessible to everyone. One Health also accepts Medicaid and most insurance plans. Please visit with your One Health school liaison to see if you are eligible for Medicaid and for enrollment support. No child will be denied services due to the inability to pay.

### Who can access our services?

One Health provides services for all students and staff, regardless of race, sex, religion, or income. We especially focus on serving students who could not otherwise afford or access health care.

### HOW ARE SERVICES PROVIDED?

School-based health services are provided via a hybrid model of in-person and virtual visits. Some appointments may be conducted through a virtual telehealth platform called Tytocare. This technology offers a way for healthcare providers to conduct a broader range of virtual visits through a high-resolution camera, thermometer, no-touch otoscope, stethoscope and tongue depressor.
